From the Superintendent's Desk

"Change is the law of life. And those who look only to the past or present are certain to miss the future." - John F. Kennedy

The above quote has always stuck with me. As an educator, I have worked to embrace change as it comes. Throughout my career, I have seen changes in technology, teaching styles and different generations of students. Each has presented me with its own unique challenges and opportunities for me to grow. Change can be difficult, but change can also bring opportunities.

On April 8, both boards of education for Friend and Exeter-Milligan voted 6-0 in favor of petitioning the Nebraska Department of Education to begin the process of consolidation. Our new consolidated school district will begin July 1, 2025. In the case of both boards, they chose to look at the opportunities that lie ahead with creating a new district. A chance to expand curricular offerings. A chance to create partnerships with local businesses and organizations. A chance to become more than we currently are and BETTER TOGETHER.

For the school boards and administration, our focus now moves to looking at both districts and what the overall vision of the district should be for the 2025-26 school year. This will take time and be a slow and all-consuming process for leadership. Some decisions will be easy, while others will take thought, reflection and much planning.

While there is still much work to be done, this is a moment that may create different feelings as we move forward. Feelings could fluctuate as we think about the past and the future. During the 2024-25 school year, we will take time to focus on both.

In the first semester, our goal at FPS is to celebrate and remember the past. During this time, we will focus on FPS, its history and celebrate being the Friend Bulldogs. The past deserves our attention and respect as we would not be here without the faculty, administration and students who came before us. Honoring the past is our first step to focusing on the future.

In the second semester, we will switch our focus to the future. We will look ahead to our full transition to the EMF Bobcats and plans for the future. Within this future, we will take a look at the traditions that were enjoyed by each district. Some traditions will continue under the new district. Other traditions will not be continued. This is a part of growth and change.

My goal and hope is that many years from now, we will look back at this time with a sense of nostalgia and goodwill as three separate towns came together to create more for our students. That has been the focus throughout this entire process–through all of the meetings, discussions, collaborative efforts and more. What is best for our students? In the end, it is my wish that this continues to push us long past this point of history as a consolidated district.

There is much to do! And I, for one, can't wait to see what the future holds.


Saline County Government Day 2024

Our FFA chapter has had an extremely busy schedule this spring. While January brought a lot of snow and cold weather, our chapter officer team traveled to UNMC to deliver the gift cards from our gift card drive for children awaiting organ donation. We delivered \$1,620 in gift cards to the med center, and we also got to meet with several children who had undergone organ transplants.

In February, Spencer Eberspacher and Jacob Weber both interviewed for their State FFA Degrees and passed their interviews. They received their awards on stage at the State FFA Convention. Additionally, Spencer interviewed for a STAR award in Placement, which is based on a student's SAE project. While he didn't make it to the State interview round, we are proud of him for applying. Abbie Milton, Will Vyhnalek and Spencer Eberspacher all received gold district finalists on their SAE proficiency award applications. Zach Spohn received a silver rating at the district level, and Mason Vossler received a gold at the district level.

Also in February, chapter members participated in multiple activities during National FFA Week, including the Drive Your Tractor to School day as well as our annual FFA Pep Rally. To round out February, FFA members competed in District Career Development Events hosted at Centennial High School with the following results:


